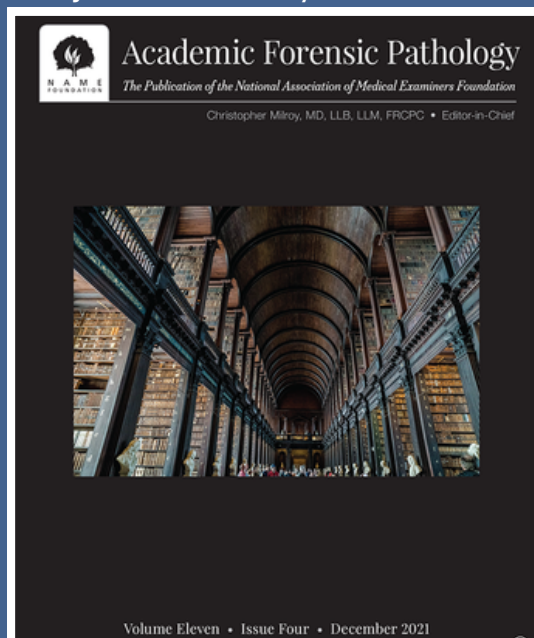
WELCOME!

HELLO, MY NAME [*FOUNDATION*] IS...

The NAME Foundation is a nonprofit charitable corporation established as the Endowment Committee of NAME in 1996 by Emeritus Trustee Thomas Noguchi, MD. When he was elected President of the National Association of Medical Examiners (NAME) in 1982, he made a pledge that as long as he lived, he would support NAME and work toward its future success. With the encouragement and support of his late wife Hisako, Dr. Noguchi formed the NAME Foundation. As a direct result of his initiative and under the oversight of the Past Presidents Committee, the "NAME Endowment Fund" was established in 1999. The official title for the entity evolved to become the "NAME Foundation," and, in 2006, the Foundation was officially incorporated as a nonprofit charitable 501(c)(3) corporation. The goals of the Foundation are to advocate for the profession of Forensic Pathology, particularly via maintaining its history and promoting education and research.

AND THE WINNERS ARE...

One of the more visible functions of the NAME Foundation is its annual sponsorship of awards presented at the Annual NAME Scientific Meeting. These include the John Smialek Best Resident/Fellow Platform/Poster Presentation (\$1,000 each), the John Pless Best Student Platform/Poster Presentation (\$500 each), and the Mary Fran Ernst Best Affiliate Presentation (\$500). The Foundation also provides the Beth Frost Early Achievement Award, travel stipends to eligible students and residents who present at the meeting and who have fulfilled the requirements (submission of abstract prior to deadline and presentation at the meeting). From 2015 through 2023 the Foundation has awarded 217 travel stipends amounting to **\$58,750**.

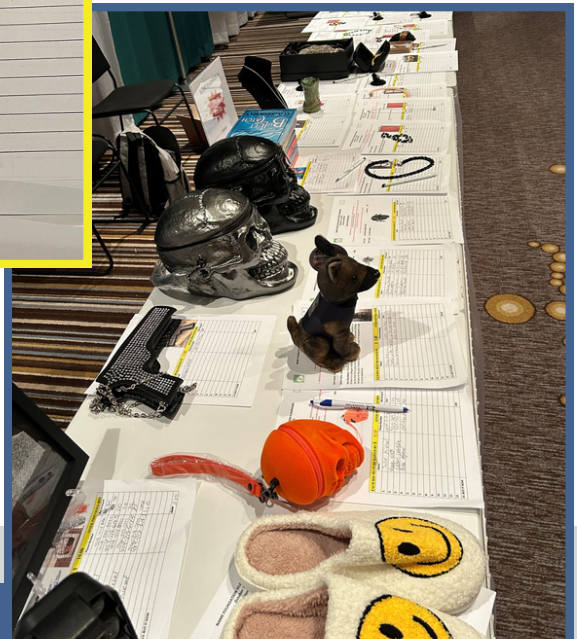
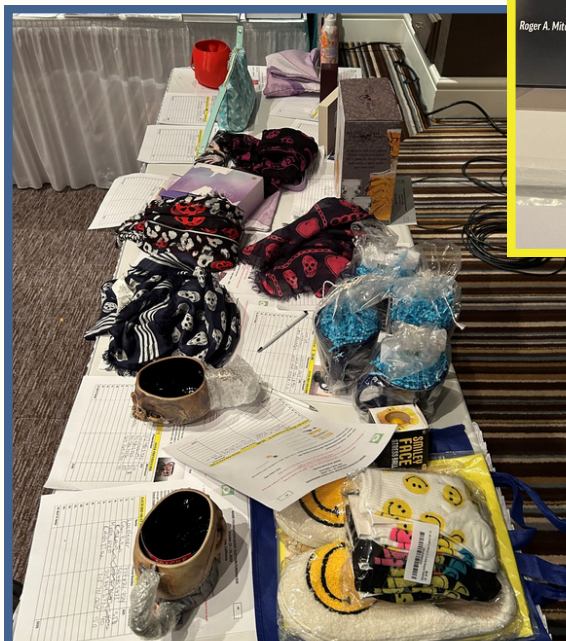

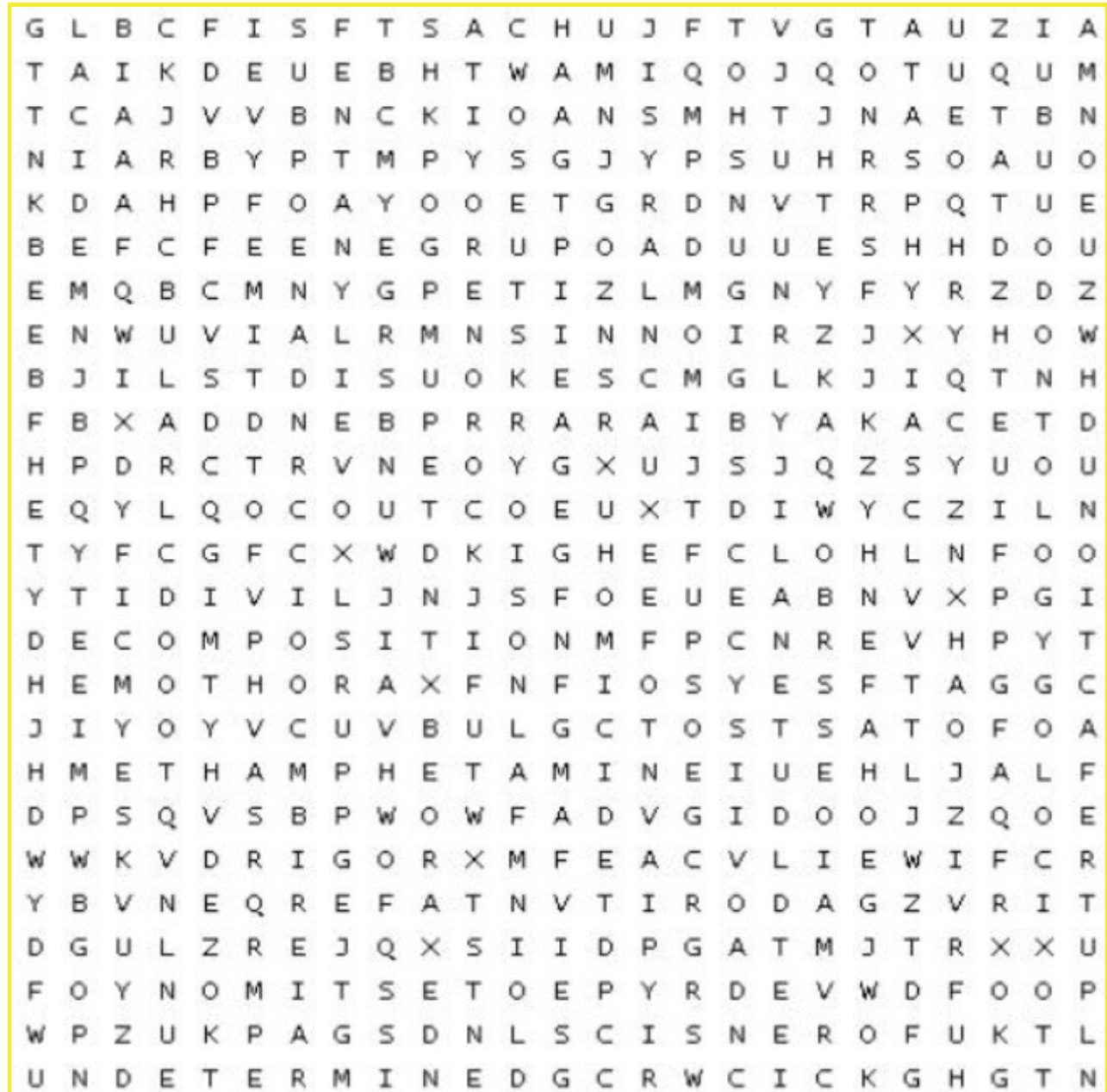
LIVE FROM... IT'S SATURDAY NIGHT!!!
